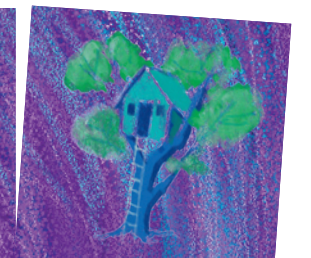
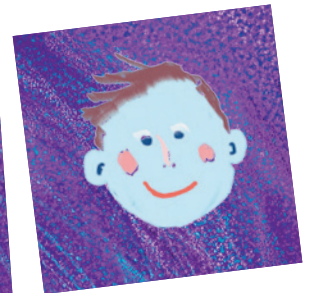


Free or low-cost kindergarten

The kindergarten fee subsidy

Do you have one of these concession cards or visas?

- Health Care Card
- Pensioner Concession Card
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Gold Card
- Asylum Seeker Bridging Visas A–F
- Temporary Protection/Humanitarian Visas 447, 451, 785 and 786
- Refugee and Special Humanitarian Visas 200–217
- Resolution of Status (RoS), Class CD, Subclass 851



Or is your child **Aboriginal** or **Torres Strait Islander**, or do you have **triplets** or **quadruplets** attending kindergarten in the same year?

If so, your kindergarten will be able to claim the kindergarten fee subsidy for each eligible child and provide a 10.75 hour program per week for free (or a longer program at a minimal cost).

The Victorian Government funds a range of services to provide a kindergarten program, to support critical learning in the early years which:

- Lays the foundations for later learning
- Sets children on a path for success in education, work and later life.
