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Description:

Which Face? is a tool that allows students to give immediate, non-verbal feedback on their competency and understanding level after a lesson.

How could I use it?

- ★ To gain feedback from an individual, group or whole class after a lesson or series of lessons.
- ★ To enable students to give their teacher feedback in a less confrontational, verbal manner.
- ★ As a tool for students to reflect on and communicate how they think they are coping with the work they have completed in the lesson that has just been taught.

Why should I use it?

To gain immediate and useful feedback from students without the necessity for the feedback to be verbal or written. It also enables students to reflect and give their feedback in a more anonymous or less confrontational manner.

When should I use it?

- ★ When evaluating a unit.
- ★ At the end of a lesson.
- ★ When reflecting on a student's progress.

How do I use it?



- ★ You will need three plastic tubs, wire baskets or cardboard boxes to collect the work in.
- ★ You will need to make three face symbols, one for each tub, basket or box.



- ★ When the class is about to leave for a break after finishing a lesson, piece of work or unit of

work, the students can put their work into the tub with the face that most closely resembles how they are feeling about their work at this point.



★ This tool can be adapted for different ages by using different symbols on each tub, basket or box. Other symbols include: 1 – 2 – 3; green – yellow – red; happy- confused – unhappy.
